A STUDY ON LIFE AND CANCER FOR THE LONG ROAD

It takes longer to recover from cancer than to be treated for it. At Young Adult Cancer Canada (YACC), recovery is about more than remission, it is about living a life worth loving, hopefully for the long road.

Recover is a community-led study where we work together to set the priorities and better understand life and cancer for young adults and how it affects your quality of life over time.

We hope to enrol 2000 people from all across Canada.

## Who can take part?

Young adults living in Canada who are over the age of 18 and were diagnosed with any type of cancer before the age of 40.

## How do I take part?

You will complete an online survey once a year for up to 5 years. Each survey will take approximately 30-45 minutes to complete.

## Why should I take part?

The information you provide will be used to increase awareness and develop programs to address the issues that young adults with cancer feel are most important.

You will be paid \$20 for each year you complete the survey.
