We hope to enrol 2000 people from all across Canada.

Who can take part?

Adults living in Canada who are over the age of 18 and were diagnosed with any type of cancer before the age of 40.

Why should I take part?

The information you provide will be used to increase awareness and develop programs to address the issues that young adults with cancer feel are most important.

You will be paid \$20 for each year you complete the survey.

How do I take part?

You will complete an online survey once a year for up to 5 years. Each survey will take approximately 30-45 minutes to complete.
